The preacher will Bishop Kenneth Nowakowski, the Ukrainian Bishop of the Holy Family Eparchy of Great Britian, who is based in London. The Ukrainian community in Scotland is particularly invited and Father Andriy, who is based in Glasgow and doing great work there, and who is responsible for the Dundee Ukrainian Community, will be bringing a Choir.

Coming just as we are.....



Here we are, another Sunday, another Eucharist, another stopping-off place to look back, to look forward and to simply be in the present moment.

Think of what's been in your life since last Sunday: have there been any moments of discovery of the Kingdom — has there been a glimpse of the *pearl of great price*, has their been a finding of a treasure? The things of the Kingdom are sometimes very close to home, found in the treasure of loving relationships and the discovery of new people, new experiences, new hopes. The treasure may indeed be close at hand, it may yet just be waiting to be discovered, or it may take a long journey to find and appreciate; it may be in our very midst but go unrecognised for years, and yet finally the penny drops, the day dawns and we discover how richly we are blessed by the Divine One.

There is a Hassidic tale [Hassidism refers to a mystical Jewish movement founded in Poland in the 18th century in reaction to the rigid academicism of rabbinical Judaism] about a Rabbi, Eisik, son of Yekel. After many years of poverty, which had never shaken his faith in God, he dreamt for three nights in a row that he should look for a treasure in Prague under the bridge which led to the King's palace, so he decided to do something about his dream.

After a long journey he arrived in Prague only to find that the bridge was patrolled, day and night by the King's guard.

Nevertheless, he went to the bridge every morning and every evening. Finally, the Captain of the guard, who had been watching him, asked him kindly if he were looking for something or someone. Rabbi Eisik told the Captain about his dream. The Captain laughed good-humouredly, and said "And so, to please the dream, poor fellow, you have worn out your shoe leather to come here! If I had followed my dreams I'd have been off to Krakow to dig for a treasure under the stove the of a Jew called Eisik, son of Yekel". Eisik bowed to the laughing Captain, travelled home to Krakow, and dug up the treasure from under his stove and built a House of Prayer.

Yes, the place where we find the treasure may indeed be very close at hand. You may find something of it this week, or indeed during the Mass we share this Sunday. It is ever present in the Word and Sacrament; it may also come to you in as a seemingly random act of kindness, or in the opportunity to serve another, it may be present in the urge you feel to empathise rather than judge, "bear with" rather than snap, show patience rather than annoyance.

Solomon in his wisdom, asked for a "discerning heart" rather than for power or riches. He was asking for the grace to recognise and see the Kingdom of God present in his life. What a request! We can make it our own, surely, this Sunday.

A warm welcome this Sunday to Bishop Stephen Robson who will celebrate the 11am Cathedral Mass. I shall celebrate the other Masses in the parishes.

This Tuesday 1 August I shall join the students on the permanent diaconate training course for their summer school at Kinnoull. Thanks once again to Father Johney Raphael who will celebrate the Cathedral 1pm Mass on Tuesday.
