Brother Douglas
Welsh RIP
will take place in
St Andrew Cathedral
on Thursday 18 August
at 7pm.**

All are welcome to attend, and a particular welcome is extended to those who were associated with Douglas through teaching in our secondary schools and in his great work for the Dunkeld Youth Service. Douglas' death marks our last direct contact with the line of Marist Brothers in Dundee, a religious order of men who have had such a great influence on so many of us, and on generations past. So please come and join us in this Mass when we not only we pray for Douglas but thank God for the witness and influence of the Marist brothers on generations of Dundonians.



John Kelly writes:

In 1986 when Bishop Vincent appointed Brother Douglas as the diocese's first Youth Officer to work with the then director Fr Eugene it was the beginning of a 37-year association with our diocese.

The position of Youth Officer meant he had to visit the young people of every parish trying to involve them in various Diocesan events including the annual pilgrimage to Lourdes where the "Dunkeld Youth Service" was given a new lease of life. As well as looking after the DYS from his office in Roseangle he also looked after Birchwood House in Birnam a country house used for retreats, holidays etc.. He would get groups of young and not so young volunteers to paint, hang wallpaper and clean the house so that it was ready for bookings.

Teaching being in his blood he decided to go back to school (in his own words "before he was too old"). He taught in St Saviours High School until the then rector of Lawside Academy, Jim Freeman, asked him to start a unit in the school for children with problems who found it difficult to fit into school. Thus the Recovery Unit was born and was still there when Douglas retired from teaching in 2006.

After his retiral the Marist Provincial was asked if Douglas could stay in Dundee in an advisory role at the new St Paul's Academy and later in St John's H.S. During this time the Mangamanuthu Project came into being where many staff and pupils visited India to help the locals. Douglas finally retired in 2013 continuing to live in Nairn Street where he continued his translation work for the Marists and welcome his many friends and confreres. In late 2019 he moved back to Glasgow where he died after a short illness on 17 July 2022.
