The Ministry of Reader

I hope to be able re-instate a rota of readers soon for the Sunday Masses (the Cathedral 6pm Mass already has one). If you feel you could proclaim the Word of God well at the Sunday Eucharist and haven't already been asked, please do speak to me soon.

The **Second Vatican Council** called for a return to the use of the Lectionary and instituted the ministry of Reader/Lector as a lay ministry in the liturgical assembly. A fruit of the Council is also the three year cycle of Sunday readings which we now enjoy.

The **Introduction to the Lectionary** is a truly inspiring exposé of the word of God and its place in the liturgy. Here is a flavour of it:

“In hearing the Word of God, the Church is built up and grows, and in the signs of the liturgical celebration, God’s many wonderful past works in the history of salvation are symbolically presented anew. God in turn makes use of the assembly of the faithful who celebrate the liturgy in order that his Word may speed in triumph and his name be exalted among all peoples”.

I envisage a session soon which all readers will be encouraged to attend. Even the finest readers can surely improve and be renewed in the ministry of proclaiming the Word.


Tea and Coffee after Cathedral 11am Mass

National Pilgrimage to Carfin

Sunday 25 September

This year marks the centenary of Carfin Grotto in the diocese of Motherwell. The annual national pilgrimage has further significance this year, because the relics of Saint Bernadette of Lourdes will be housed at the Grotto for a week at that time. Mass will be celebrated at 3pm that day in the grounds of the grotto and will be followed by a Rosary Procession. Everyone is welcome to attend.



Unfortunately, at the time of writing, I am unsure if any of our local parishes are organising bus transport to this event.

Meeting of Priests: The priests of the Diocese will meet this coming Thursday from 1pm at St Mary’s, Forebank. Also, a smart meter will be being installed that morning at the Cathedral and *Electroguard* are coming to Forebank, so all this necessitates the Mass times being adjusted!

Ongoing works

As you may have noticed that the Cathedral gutterings have recently been cleaned and the roof and high stone work fully inspected. As you would expect with a building of such age as the Cathedral (built in 1836), there is more work to be done and this will be undertaken in the second half of September. It will be a considerable expense, but thanks to your ongoing generosity we have sufficient funds to cover all the costs.

The guys from the company “Igoe-up” (*cleverly named I thought!*) will also be turning their attentions to St Mary’s, Forebank. Mark, the roofer, has already cleared overgrown plants and debris from above the sacristy corridor where there has been water ingress again.

The initial stage of work on the roof at Our Lady of Good Counsel started on Friday past and I await to hear from our Diocesan Property co-ordinator John O’Meara, of the developments there.
