Have you perhaps been told you're not allowed to come for some reason, or has it just been so long, or are you perhaps worried that you've not been to Confession in a long time?


Sometimes people deprive themselves of the Eucharistic food when there is actually no canonical reason for them to do so, and all that is needed is a chance to put things straight and be reassured.
