The hymn "Our Father, we have wandered" (set to Bach's *Passion Chorale*) which will be sung at some of our Masses this Sunday, invites us to come home, out of exile and to receive the gifts of "calf, robe and ring" which that prodigal Father had all ready as he waited longingly for the return of the wayward son.



Our Father, we have wandered and hidden from your face, in foolishness have squandered your legacy of grace.


But now, in exile dwelling, we rise with fear and shame, as distant but compelling, we hear you call our name.
