The wedding feast of the Kingdom.

A reflection:

From the generous landowner who wanted to give work even to those who came “at the eleventh hour”, to the father and the two sons, both of whom changed their minds, then to the master who let out his vineyard to the tenants, and now to a King who gives a wedding feast. What binds all these parable-characters together? *The Kingdom of heaven is like....*this is Jesus' great concern in his preaching, to usher in God's Reign, which is

present in himself. He was the “son and heir” to the vineyard of last Sunday's Gospel, and now he is the “son” whose wedding feast to his Church is celebrated in the parable today. The invitation from the Kingly-Father who has been angered that the original invitees deigned not to attend, is open to all and generous, like that of the God of the Psalms, who “opens wide his hand and grants the desires of all who live”. Indeed, the wedding feast is a celebration of salvation itself, and the parable is addressed once again to the “chief priests and elders of the people”.

The parable and its invitation, like previous parables and the work of the vineyard entrusted to those who receive the call, is really an outline of salvation history from the Christian perspective. The Lord who tells it is surely saddened that Israel (at least in her chief priests and elders) has either downright refused the final revelation and invitation to the Kingdom banquet, issued in the person of the Promised Messiah, the “son of the king”, having already maltreated the servants of God (the prophets), or sought to accept the invitation but refused to wear the wedding garment of the new covenant when attending the feast.

Nevertheless, the king issues the invitation to all, (mindful of the kingdom's eleventh hour policy!) to “bad and good alike”, seeking us out on the highways and byways of our lives, not resting until the banquet hall is full. But, remember to wear the wedding garment of love, joy and readiness to celebrate when you accept the invitation to share the feast!

Intercessions: Take time to voice your own prayers, and conclude with the *Our Father*.

You lead us day after day through paths of joy and peace. **We thank you, O Lord.**

Your grace and goodness accompany us as we journey along the paths of time to your heavenly dwelling.

Conclusion

O God of the banquet,
the wedding feast of Christ your Son,
is the Eucharist of your Church,
which is nourishment for our lives
and the gate of heaven to all your people.
Open our community to all who seek you;
fill it with the rich diversities of gifts and talents
with which you have adorned your world.

May our lives bear witness to the banquet of eternal life, where all will be welcome. Amen

SAINTS OF THE WEEK



On 15 October, the Church honours **St Teresa of Avila**, a sixteenth century mystic, a great reformer of religious life, a courageous adviser to the clergy and a Doctor of the church. I had the pleasure of visiting her convent in Avila with Bishop Logan a number of years ago. In Dundee, we used to have a beautiful Church in Graham Street dedicated to Teresa of Avila.

St Margaret Mary Alacoque, honoured on 16 October, was a visionary of the divine mercy of Jesus, expressed in devotion to his Sacred Heart. Most churches have an image or shrine honouring the heart of Jesus, a "fount of love and mercy". This devotion is in fine harmony with the spirit of the liturgy, for that is the place where our prayer is answered: "unfold to us the treasures of thy grace" The 1985 work by Sister Annice Callaghan of Oakland, California on the pierced heart of Jesus was a formative element in my own spirituality.

St Ignatius of Antioch, a bishop whose memorial falls on Saturday 17 October, was martyred for the

faith around the year 107. His many letters, a treasure of the early Church, show a man completely given over to the love and service of Christ, “even unto death”.

Rosary Whirlwind October 2020 for Faith, Life & Peace

October is traditionally the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. Nations around the world this year are hosting their great Rosary Crusades and we are invited to join them, On Saturday 31 October, the Eve of All Saints’ Day, there will be a *National Rosary Rally* in Britain, where local churches throughout these islands are invited to take an hour where the Rosary is said in parishes and homes throughout the Diocese.


