*Next Sunday: Feast of the Holy Family -
Year of Luke (C)*

Dear Friends and Parishioners,
Today we reach the Fourth Sunday of the Advent season, where we find Mary emerging as the faithful daughter of Sion, fulfilling Zephaniah's prophecy in last Sunday's first reading and becoming a model of discipleship for all God's people, as she not only receives the Word of God with faith, but shares that Word in joy at the home of Elizabeth, and makes that Word real in the world even before her Son's birth as she sings her *Magnificat* of justice and mercy.

During our Masses this Sunday we shall sing the old Novena hymn *O Purest of creatures*, which beautifully describes Mary's readiness to take on the vocation of being Mother of the Redeemer.

The fourth week of Advent, which we celebrate in full this year, brings us to the joyous night and day of the Nativity of the Lord. I especially look forward to welcoming you, your families and loved ones to our Christmas Masses across the three churches. Please do invite anyone whom you think would appreciate being part of our celebrations to come with you: a warm welcome awaits everyone.

The **Midnight Mass of Christmas** is a particularly rich spiritual experience, and has a long and noble tradition in our Catholic life. For our three churches the Midnight Mass will be celebrated in the Cathedral Church, the *Mother Church* of the Diocese of the Diocese of Dunkeld. Everyone is welcome here to share in this *once-a-year* celebration of the Lord's birth.

Important notice regarding the Sunday Mass obligation

A number of parishioners have been in touch with me since I published the letter of the Bishops' Conference of Scotland in the newsletter a couple of weeks back in which the Bishops inform us that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will be reintroduced from the weekend of Sunday 2 January 2022.

At the time of writing this newsletter this decision has not been rescinded, but it is very important to state that if you feel vulnerable in any way regarding coming to Mass, if you are still shielding, if you feel in any way unwell, then **you should stay at home** and **there will be no culpability on your part for not attending**.

I want you to feel reassured in your decision making. Please do not take any risks in the present state of affairs with the various covid strains. I hope this note reassures.

The revised Scottish Government guidelines in the light of the new covid variant only affects churches in terms of celebrant, musicians/singers being two metres apart while unmasked. This also applies to those who have an exemption from wearing a mask. As and when any new restrictions/guidelines are published you can be assured these will be put into practice.

Sandra Scott and Linda Scott will now take over the administration of the 200 club.


If you have not yet paid your dues, could you please do so as soon as possible., this will help us keep the books in order; the Christmas draw will be made soon.

On the Feast of the holy Innocents, Tuesday 28 December, the Mass in the Cathedral at 1pm will bring all the pro life causes before the Lord in prayer.



So much of the way we celebrate Christ's coming into the world is wrapped up (*pardon the pun!*) in the custom of giving and receiving gifts. This giving and receiving is a symbol of the true "presents" (presence) of the season which await our fresh discovery each year at Christmas time.

Not only once a year at Christmas, but every week, the believing community which gathers together is gifted with the Sacred Liturgy—the rites, readings, prayers, psalms, songs and gestures which grace us with an ever new disclosure of God's ways and works.

Key to *unwrapping* the gift of the Word of God for this Fourth Sunday of Advent is the simple question of Elizabeth: "**Why should I be honoured....?**"



Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?


"Why should I be honoured?" underscores the surprising wisdom of God, who seems to choose:

- **the least likely people** (c.f. the Gospel today — Mary and Elizabeth),
- **the least likely places** (c.f. the First Reading today—Bethlehem; and the Second Reading: human flesh) and ...
- **the least like methods** (c.f. the Second Reading today: Jesus' sacrifice) in order to give his people his saving presence.

Next to the Easter Triduum and its related feasts, the Church holds most sacred this memory of Christ's birth. The feast now approaching calls forth from us a sense of wonder and awe, and with Elizabeth we should surely gratefully accept the good news, asking, *Why should we be so honoured to be visited this way by our God?*

But what good is this visitation and the wonderful love of God in our midst if such news is not shared with all those who are his people? The messengers (*angels*, as we say) who brought the good news to the shepherds were first in the line of a glorious tradition of service to the Gospel. Following on, there were apostles and martyrs, witnesses and preachers, and now there is **us**.

For the Christmas feast which approaches I say to you: you have been **honoured** with a visit in your life from God. Bring others to that same visitation: invite them to come and share our Christmas Eucharist and to belong in faith with us, in a vibrant, joyous, loving and forgiving community of disciples.
