**Dear Friends and Parishioners,**

Ash Wednesday was a day of great grace for us, without doubt. Our Churches were very busy at all the Masses for the Liturgy of ashes, and the enthusiastic singing was a powerful symbol of everyone's desire to enter into the spirit of the Lenten season and begin the journey to Easter *with mind and heart renewed*, as the Liturgy says.

I was especially glad to welcome all the boys and girls from Our Lady's Primary School to the church for their own afternoon Liturgy of ashes.

Now the long journey towards the Passover Feast of Easter has begun and we are invited to make the most of it. Our Holy Father Pope Francis advises us thus though: "No act of virtue can be great if it is not followed by advantage for others. So no matter how much time you spend fasting, no matter how much you sleep on a hard floor, and eat ashes and sigh continually, if you do no good to others, you do nothing great."

**Sunday afternoon Prayer for Ukraine**

This Sunday 6 March, the First Sunday of Lent, there will be **Sung Vespers and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 4pm** in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Nethergate, Dundee.

At the beginning of the Liturgy, following Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the Opening Prayer there will be fifteen minutes of silent prayer for the suffering people of Ukraine, and we shall keep them especially in our hearts as we celebrate the Evening Prayer of the Church in Sung Vespers. I warmly invite you to join us.

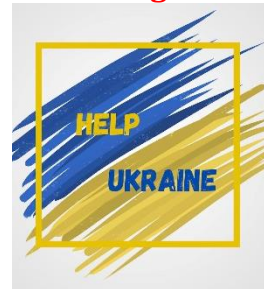

**Practical gifts for the people of Ukraine**



One of our young parishioners at the Cathedral, Beth McDonald is organising transport to take items to Edinburgh that will go from there to the help the people of Ukraine: Could you help by bringing

along to the Cathedral – by next Sunday night at the latest - any of the following items: blankets, raincoats, personal hygiene products, wet wipes, toothbrushes, toothpaste, pampers, instant food like packet soup that can be used with boiling water, energy bars, pasta, dried fruit?

Any items can be left in the baptistry at the Cathedral between now and next Sunday after the evening Mass. They will be transported to Edinburgh on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> for their ongoing journey.

This coming Thursday 10 March we keep the feast of a Scottish martyr, **St John Ogilvie**. Sentenced to death for his refusal to deny his Catholic faith, this courageous priest was hanged at Glasgow Cross in 1615 at the age

of thirty-six. Please try to come to Mass on Thursday as we keep his feast day.

I love the words of the hymn written to honour him by JK Robertson, set to music by the famous Mother Turnbull of Craiglochart, “O loved of God”. Its first stanza reads:

*O loved of God, wearing the martyr’s thorns,  
bright with that blood the hero best adorns!  
From such a proffered crown  
our feebler souls would flee;  
yet in our lesser trials we turn for strength to thee.*

On **Thursday 17 March**, the Feast of St Patrick, the Canons of the Dunkeld Chapter will be meeting in the Cathedral. There will be midday Prayer and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament with the Canons at 12noon that day. All Welcome. 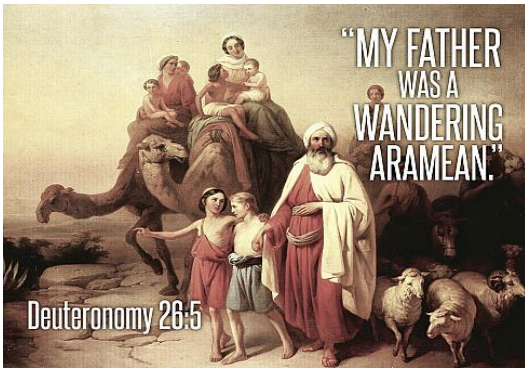
**There are still some Lent editions of *Day by Day* at the back of the Church; these provide helpful focuses for each day of Lent.**

## SCIAF meeting report

Sincere thanks to those who represented our parish at the recent diocesan SCIAF meeting.

The focus for this year's Wee Box Big Change campaign is on the story of one family who represent the hardship and suffering of smallholder farmers who, although skilled and experienced, have been drastically affected by the climate emergency. The smallholder farmers grow food both to nourish their families and to sell. They plant their crops which can be burned by the heat or washed away in a flood and they have no way of predicting what the weather will do and therefore no means of working around it.

SCIAF has been assisting with practical solutions - crops which require very little rain, learning around how to produce organic compost and the provision of Eco stoves for cooking.

Some SCIAF boxes have arrived for your take away for the Lenten alms, but if you don't get one this Sunday don't worry, more are on the way.

Future suggestions are that we have a sponsored beach clean, and already one parishioner has committed to doing The Kilt Walk later in the year in aid of SCIAF.

## SCIAF COFFEE MORNING

Our main inter-parish event along with St Joseph's will be the traditional Coffee Morning held in the Cathedral Hall after the 10am Mass on Saturday 26 March. Can I invite the parishioners from across our three churches to support this event? As always, we would welcome your donations in advance of the event – bottles, raffle prizes etc and home baking which can be dropped off the day before or early on the morning of the 26<sup>th</sup>.

“My Father was a wandering Aramean”. With these words the Liturgy of the Word opens this Sunday, and they represent an ancient creed of the chosen people. They knew their roots: they had originally been a wandering people, the basic meaning of the word “Hebrew”. They recognised that their ancestors were treated harshly in Egypt, having started small in numbers but becoming great in population. In their creed they are sure of one thing: that it was God who rescued them from their Egyptian oppressors, God, the One with “mighty hand and outstretched arm”. They understood from earliest times their God as a Rescuer, one who could be counted on: a Rock indeed! When we celebrate the great Vigil of Easter, that theme of God as Rescuer will come to the fore again: in Christ we find the One who rescues us even from the clutches of death itself.

In our Old Testament tradition the gift of a land to dwell in is key to the people's identity and security. Their core belief is that God brought them out of Egypt and led them to a land they could call their own. Moses is their great leader, spokesperson, prophet and guide. In his ministry the people saw the original promise to Abraham being fulfilled – a land to dwell in and many descendants. At the verge of the Jordan, before they enter the Promised Land, Moses put a stark choice before the people: life and prosperity or death and disaster. He urged them to “choose life then, for on this depends your long stay in the land you are crossing the Jordan to enter”.

Jesus “chooses life” always and urges us to do the same. The promised land he holds out to us is the land of heaven, the true land “flowing with milk and honey”. But as we meet at every Eucharist to have a foretaste of that promised land we cannot but hold deep in our hearts the people who have had to flee their physical homeland in recent days. Our fervent prayer is for them. Please join us if you can for the afternoon prayer for Ukraine and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in the Cathedral this Sunday afternoon at 4pm.

## Diocesan Lourdes Pilgrimage

It has been uncertain whether the Diocese of Dunkeld would be able to make a pilgrimage this year. However, following on from a Lourdes Committee Meeting, it has been decided to seek out what interest there may be in going to Lourdes this summer.

Would you be interested in going to Lourdes this summer? You don't need to make a definite commitment at this point, but once there is an idea of numbers a more definite proposal can be made.

If it goes ahead, the pilgrimage would depart from Edinburgh by air on Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> July - Friday, 15<sup>th</sup> July. The approximate cost would be hopefully £800-900 for a nice hotel.

It looks as though the Pilgrimage, if we have sufficient interest, may only be for approximately 80 pilgrims this year. However, it would be a start!
